Show the Truth July Mission

President's Message by Phil Arnsby

On Sunday, July 11, I loaded my car with a week's supply of clothes and headed for Brantford for a Show the Truth Mission Tour. The 14 presentations of the mission would take place in Kitchener, Guelph, Brantford, Hamilton and Ancaster.

I located St. Basil's church on a map and felt some comfort that I would be able to find the place. My wife Elaine was heading in the opposite direction to Windsor's Hotel Dieu Hospital where her dad was struggling with his health.

I arrived at the church hall at about 7:30 p.m. before the bus load of other pro-lifers arrived and met a Knights of Columbus keeper of the keys. I selected a custodian's storage supply room as my accommodations for the week. In short order, the bus and its 30 or so young and old piled into the church hall and started to roll out sleeping bags and air mattresses. The adult women lucked out and were ushered to the parish rectory which was air conditioned. Others arrived by car and soon the hall rang with laughter and fellowship. Most hadn't seen each other since last summer and there was much to catch up on. This special group of people who, out of the population of Ontario, said YES to the Lord would witness on the street daily for about 6 hours holding graphic signs of aborted fetuses. Thousands would view these slaughtered pre-born children who never made it alive into the light of day.

At times, the days were blistering hot and the biggest challenge was ensuring the young people wore hats, carried shade umbrellas, and drank sufficient water while holding their signs. Those on the line holding signs talked to hundreds about life issues that week. We were thankful that Fr. Don Sanvido welcomed us to St. Basil's, arranged for the Knights to help feed us and stood with us on the streets. Fr. Joe Burg, Fr. Ron Myers and Fr. Tony Van Hee also witnessed with us. Prayers, daily mass and these priests were a blessing for us.

While we were at McMaster University a Student nurse approached me at a bus stop to ask about our large photos. She calmly asked many questions:

"Why did we show such graphic photos?"

"Does what we do make a difference?"

"What should a mother tell her children about the images?"

"Should an animal not also be protected from being killed?"

"If she (the nurse) wanted to complete her studies but got pregnant, wouldn't it be better to abort the child and complete her studies (obstetrics) so that she could save many babies (only sacrifice one)?"

So I answered each of her questions. On two occasions her bus came and she declined to get on it because she wanted to continue our conversation. Finally after 40 minutes of discussion, I advised her to get the third bus because, as line captain, I had to pull my line in the next 5 minutes. The 90 minutes of presentation was over and the signs had to be returned to the bus. She shook my hand, smiled and thanked me for spending the time clarifying many of her concerns.

Who knows, in the future she may stand with us. Next stop, Toronto area from August 9 to 13...



Woman Jailed for Abortion Counseling in Toronto Acquitted, Set Free

Mary's path to becoming a prisoner of conscience began on Monday, March 29, during Holy Week, when she entered the "Woman's Care" abortion facility. At that time she said she was able to "speak to a few grieving Dads, whose partners had already gone in for their abortions, and let them know about project Rachael, a support system for post abortion parents."

After about 45 minutes the police arrived and escorted her away from the facility.

On Tuesday, March 30, Mary again went to witness to life, this time to the "Choice in Health" abortion center, where she said she

was able to counsel women, abortion workers, and the police for nearly 45 minutes before she was carried away by officers and put in jail.

At a hearing earlier this month, the presiding judge in the case had said that Mary could be let out of jail immediately if she agreed to three conditions, one of which was not to stand on the sidewalk in front of the Choice in Health abortion facility, or to enter the building. The young pro-life activist, however, said that she could not agree to this condition, and so was returned to jail pending a further hearing.

While that hearing was originally not set to happen until September, Jane Wagner, Mary's mother, told LSN that earlier this week Mary's lawyers told her that the judge had had a "change of heart".

Eleven years ago, I chose life.

At 16 years old, I found out I was pregnant, and I was nearing the end of my first trimester.

I was a good student and had lots of friends, but I made the choice to have sex at a young age and I wound up pregnant. My parents were very scared and worried for me and the future that I would have as well as the future of this baby.

My Mother had set up an appointment for me to meet with an organization to discuss my options. All that were involved felt it was a good choice for me to have an abortion. At the time, I thought that it wouldn't be that bad. The baby would be gone and I could continue on with my life. As the appointment day grew near, I was starting to wonder if this was such a good idea. I had recently had an ultrasound and the image of this growing baby was in my head. I started thinking well maybe I could do it, maybe I could be a mom, but then there was the fear of: would I be a good mother, how will I raise this child on my own? So I set out on the morning of my appointment. I decided this was for the best. As I was walking to catch the bus, coincidence or not, there were prolife picketers in the area where I was waiting for the bus. They were holding up signs that showed what the unborn fetus looks like at the exact gestational stage that I was at. As I looked at the signs, I started thinking about this little person inside me and images of the ultrasound were popping into my head. I couldn't do it. It wasn't right.

Later that day, my mother phoned me to ask how the appointment went. I told her I didn't know, and she didn't understand what I meant by, I didn't know. I told her I didn't know how it went because I didn't go. The way I felt was that if I was going to be responsible enough to have sex and get pregnant, I was going to be responsible for the life that I created. I was going to be the best mother I could be.

Eleven years later, I have a happy, healthy & intelligent son, Zack! My son is my world; I couldn't imagine my life without him in it. Although having a child at a young age was a struggle, it has been very rewarding. Due to the small age difference, Zack and I have grown as mother and son, to friends. We are very close and do almost everything together.

When times were tough, as long as Zack was in my life, that was all that mattered to me. He was happy, therefore, I was happy. Now nearly 11 years old, Zack is in grade 5 and getting mostly all A's on his report cards, he is so smart! He is also very athletic. This year will be his fifth hockey season as a Jr. Kitchener Ranger. He has lots of friends, a big heart and always willing to lend a hand. When I look at my son I think what would



life have been like had I chosen the other option, and I can't even imagine. I am so proud of my child. I am so proud of myself for raising such a wonderful boy, who someday will be a strong and caring man.

Every decision I have made going forward has been based on how it will not only affect me, but is it the best decision for Zack. He is my number one. He is my heart & soul, and I am so glad I saw those signs 11 years ago. Thank you Right to Life, you have no idea how you have changed my life!

Bitter Pill

When the pill first came out, it was heralded by women's rights activists as an unprecedented agent of equalization. Unfettered by a disruptive pregnancy, women could now remain sexually active while getting a post-secondary education and be able to climb the ladder of power on an equal footing with their male counterparts. Indeed, to a large extent, this has occurred.

Economist Timothy Reichert, in the May edition of *First Things* magazine, published a remarkable essay that flies utterly in the face of conventional wisdom. He presented a compelling argument that the widespread use of contraception has led directly to a shifting of wealth and power away from women.

Whereas previously, his argument goes, men and women both participated in a common "mating market," modern contraceptives like the pill split this market into two separate markets - "sexual relationship" and "marriage". Under this new system, women in the early years of their adult lives have the upper hand in the sex market, but once they enter the marriage market, they are greatly disadvantaged. The reason is biological. Women have a limited window of opportunity in which to bear children and those who wish to start a family must enter the marriage market and seek out a suitable mate before the window is closed by menopause. Men, on the other hand, are under no such time constraints and may remain in the sex market as long as they wish. In a society lacking strong moral norms, the inevitable result is a scarcity of marriageable men, forcing women to make bad "deals", settling with less-than-suitable mates.

Bad marriages create a demand for easy divorce which means newlyweds are entering marriage with more distrust and a lessened level of commitment. Because they cannot guarantee their husbands will always be there to provide for them, women must remain financially independent even in marriage which decreases the amount

of time they are able to spend with their children and their homes. When both spouses specialize in the same area of life, namely, providing an income, this in turn decreases the "comparative advantage" obtained by marriage. The bonds of the marital relationship weaken and a "sexless ennui" settles in, wherein "men and women become, quite simply, less interesting to one another."

This new marital dynamic has an enormous effect on economics. In real estate, for example the ubiquity of wealthy double-income families means that housing prices are being bid ever higher. This, in turn, adds a financial burden that reinforces the need women feel to spend more time earning money and less time raising a family.

Reichert also argues that contraception "increases the incidence of infidelity". Because men are more likely to be unfaithful than women, it is women who are most often left with the broken heart and feelings of betrayal.

The contraceptive lifestyle creates a demand for abortion as a "secondary insurance" against pregnancy. In this case, again, the woman is the greater loser. She is the one to face the health risks and has to bear the heavier share of post-abortion emotional trauma.

Reichert sees a "redistribution of welfare" and power from the weak to the strong; from the old, the young, the childbearing and childrearing women, to the men, who are bound by ever-weakening ties of responsibility.

What does this mean for the future of our society? The true nature and extent of the 'contraceptive revolution' has, in fact been almost universally misjudged, and remains veiled in great ignorance to a world that has embraced it as a new way of life.

Development & Peace Apologized to Pro-Life Group after Legal Threat

TORONTO, July 6, 2010, LifeSiteNews.com – In a letter made public today, the Canadian Catholic Organization for Development & Peace (D&P), the official development arm of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, issued an apology to Campaign Life Coalition (CLC). The letter comes in response to an April 20 CLC lawyer's letter noting slanderous statements in a document produced by D&P and threatening legal action. D&P has now retracted the statements in question and apologized.

The letter, signed by D&P executive director Michael Casey, acknowledges the two most flagrantly slanderous statements in its Q&A document, which was obtained by LifeSiteNews.com (LSN) in mid March.

Those slanderous statements were:

–“These groups are part of the far right wing fringe element of North American society and have themselves been

associated with groups and individuals who have resorted to violence to publicize their cause and achieve their objectives.”

–“These single-issue militant advocacy groups, particularly those focusing on anti-abortion advocacy, continuously misrepresent facts and distort reality to serve their purpose.”

Responding to these statements, the new D&P letter states: “DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE acknowledges that any inferred or implied references to Campaign Life Coalition in these quotations are false, and we unreservedly retract these comments. We extend our sincere apologies to Campaign Life Coalition for any embarrassment that this document may have caused.”

As of this date, the problems with D&P's funding practices remain unresolved. Numerous groups in receipt of D&P funding continue to advocate for abortion.

LSN continues to hope that D&P, as the official development arm of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, will adhere to the moral teachings of the Catholic Church and refuse to fund groups which advocate abortion, contraception, homosexuality and the like.

Lauren, one of the GAP volunteers from UVic, was asked the following question at GAP: "What would you say to me if I had had an abortion?" She happened to relay that to a student named "Melissa" whom she had just met at the University of Central Florida.

She explained to Melissa her response to that question: "If you told me you had had an abortion, I apologize if this is a bit forward, but the first thing I would want you to know is that I love you." Little did Lauren know how meaningful it was for Melissa to hear that.

Lauren explains, "She looked me in the eye and told me her story: 'I was pregnant five months ago.' I looked down at her stomach; she was no longer. Her eyes were filled with tears. She told me how she felt so forced by the 'counselors' at Planned Parenthood. She said, 'They didn't tell me I'd feel like this afterwards.' She paused and let out a heavy sigh. This wonderful, beautiful young woman whom I had only known for maybe an hour, locked eyes with me and said, 'There isn't a day goes by that I don't think about what I did to my baby; you can tell people that.'" Lauren proceeded to have a touching conversation with Melissa who conveyed she was glad they talked.

This encounter was a reminder that the wounded are everywhere. We do not help them by ignoring their pain and hiding the truth. We help them by embracing them and showing them a path to new life.

LATEST ADULT STEM CELL ADVANCE GIVES SIGHT TO THE BLIND

WASHINGTON, D.C. - For individuals blinded by chemical burn, the ever advancing field of adult stem-cell research has provided yet another astonishing cure – giving them sight through their own stem cells.

Italian researchers have reported developing a very successful therapy to cure those who were either blinded, or whose vision was severely impaired by chemical burn to their corneas. Such burns can come about through handling everything from toxic cleaning substances at home to heavy-duty chemicals at work.


The new stem-cell therapy, however, is specific to chemical burns and cannot be used to remedy other diseases or damages to the eye, such as glaucoma or retinal damage.

In a study published by the New England Journal of Medicine, scientists treated 107 eyes of 106 patients with stem cells derived from the limbus, the rim around the cornea, where stem cells are naturally produced by the body to repair the cornea.

The researchers derived the stem cells from a patient's healthy eye, and then encouraged them to multiply. Once they had enough stem cells, they removed the scar tissue over the bad eye and grafted the stem cells onto the cornea, which then began to generate new corneal tissues. After 12-24 months had passed, these grafts were then followed up by corrective surgeries.

One patient had severe alkali burns on both his eyes from 1948. Researchers, however, were able to adapt and derive limbal stem-cell cultures with biopsied tissue taken from the patient's left eye. The therapy managed to successfully restore both corneal surfaces, transitioning the man from blindness to having an almost normal, combined vision of close to 20/30. Follow-ups after two and five years showed that both eyes were stable after the treatment.

It is only the field of adult stem cell research that has been on the cutting edge of developing the "miracle cures" demanded by the public. Even better, the adult stem cells derived from patients are completely compatible with the body, and do not carry the risk of rejection, or the needed drugs to prevent rejection, as is the case with therapies using embryonic stem cells.

The Story of Bryce Daniel

Previous to Bryce's conception, his mom and dad struggled to have children, facing the heartbreak of two miscarried babies before conceiving a third time. In the 35th week of this third pregnancy, an ultrasound revealed that their long-awaited baby had hydrocephaly: a condition in which fluid builds up in the brain, and which often leads to death shortly after birth. Specialists recommended abortion, and implied that her future fertility was on the line if she did not. One specialist said, "We could decompress your baby's head and take him out normally, so you can have kids again."

"She said to me I could abort my child... I was not going to end the life of my baby. They took me to the delivery room and they did a C-section and took my baby out, and they said "It's a boy" and there wasn't a sound in the room." For thirteen minutes, Bryce neither moved nor breathed.

"There was no baby crying like there is supposed to be crying... there was no... there wasn't a sound in the room. Then I heard my baby being baptized and I can remember them saying to my husband 'You'd better bring the baby over to his mom because the only thing he has right now is a heart beat and that's leaving him.' Dan brought the boy over to me and he was purple and not moving... not crying... not doing anything. And Dan brought him over by my head to say goodbye.

I remember saying, 'Lord, please give me more time with my baby,'"—a prayer that was soon answered above and beyond the parents' hopes. He has now surpassed his 4th birthday and, as one can see in the photos, is a vibrant and active little boy.

"Bryce is a true miracle to our lives. I believe the Lord took those 13 minutes that he did not breathe or move and healed him. We were also blessed with two more miracle baby girls."
