DRAB BILLBOARD BRINGS GREAT RESPONSE

President's Message by Phil Arnsby

It was the first week in March and my wife Elaine and I wanted to see the billboard which the London Area Right to Life had paid Pattison Signs to post at the corner of Oxford and Talbot St. The location was selected because it was adjacent to Tim Horton's and close to the University. We had tried unsuccessfully to put information ads in the university's two papers (The Gazette and Western News).

On each side of our billboard were two colourful and bright billboards which made our message look lacklustre and drab in its grey, black and white format. There was some muted red lettering but I wondered how the designer could have developed such a billboard. The next morning I called my contact at Pattison Signs and asked if I could have a bright band of background colour behind the words "Abortion - Have we gone too far?" While I was pondering the cost and the two weeks for the installation, I got a call that our billboard was a hot topic of conversation on a local radio station 1290 AM. It was great. Some commented that it was inappropriate having such a billboard of this nature and that it was not accurate because abortions are not done for all 9 months.

Elaine phoned the station informing them and the audience that there has been no law since 1988 and that Stats Canada lists late term abortions in Canada as 7% of all abortions; this means over 700 each year of those reported are late term. Many are sent to Washington, Oregon and Kansas in the U.S. at \$5000 per abortion. Our taxes pay for these and other abortions to the tune of over \$30,000,000 a year in Ontario alone.

Then another radio station talk show and Rogers TV did an interview with me about the billboard and pro-life issues. I got a call from a reporter from the University student paper. She understood our billboard ad had been removed and she was anxious to get my reaction. After verifying with Tim Horton's staff that our billboard was still there she sounded disappointed and was uninterested in any other pro-life information. Oh well!

Joe Matayas, a London Free Press reporter wrote an article "Anti-abortion billboard branded 'misleading, false'". It was a reasonable article. I was quoted along with a number of pro-abortion advocates. To have that photo in the paper for all to see was wonderful. The last paragraph reads as follows:

"Canadian doctors follow international guidelines and won't do abortion after 23 weeks and 6 days, said a spokesperson for the Schulich School of Medicine and Dentistry at the University of Western Ontario". (Abortions are done at the University Hospital.)

'Seems to me that the above statement and a photo of a child in the womb at 20 weeks would form an interesting billboard in the fall when the students come back'.



Largest March for Life Ever 8,000 Attend Rally on Parliament Hill



A massive crowd of 8,000 pro-life demonstrators, the majority of whom were youth, gathered on Parliament Hill in Ottawa on May 8th. The day's events began with a Protestant prayer service at St. George Anglican Church and a Catholic Mass, at Notre Dame Basilica, was celebrated by Ottawa Archbishop Terrence Prendergast. The Archbishop later walked in the March. The Basilica, which can hold a capacity crowd of 1200, was packed to the rafters.

London's Pat O'Brien, former MP, introduced the various MPs who were present. Pat informed the crowd, "This is consistently the largest demonstration to come to Parliament each year."

Pro-life, Christian musician, David McDonald, led the enthusiastic crowd in song.

Women and men from Silent No More Awareness gave their testimonies accompanied by Rev. Alveda King, civil rights activist and niece of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Father Frank Pavone, International Priests for Life, and Janet Moranna, Director of the U.S. Silent No More. Rev. King said she knows only too well the injustice of denying the most basic civil

right, the right to life, to any innocent person and sees abortion as the civil rights issue of the 21st Century.

On the route, the abortuary on Banks St. is where the pro-life crowd is asked to keep silence and to pray for an end to abortion in Canada. Show the Truth Canada was present again at the abortuary to stand in solidarity with the little ones and to show the horrible reality of abortion to all those who passed by. There was a minor attempt to force us to move away by an overenthusiastic security guard who worked for a nearby bank. But the police were supportive of us and very efficient in clearing the streets of vehicles for the Marchers. Many pamphlets were offered to spectators and Marchers alike and were generally well accepted, especially by the pro-life demonstrators.

Meanwhile, on the west coast, the first, annual March for Life was held in Victoria, B.C. with over 1,000 participants. Prior to the March, the crowd gathered on the steps of Centennial Square with signs provided by the Knights of Columbus and Pro Life B.C. that read "Women need support not abortion" and "We regret our abortion."

Canadian citizens of all ages, including abortion activists, are aware of a changing atmosphere in Canada. Let's put our best effort into joining the March next year - after all, abortion is THE CIVIL RIGHTS ISSUE OF THE 21ST CENTURY.

HIGHLIGHTS of Alliance for Life Ontario Conference

On April 18 & 19, Phil and I had the privilege of attending the AFLO Conference in Ancaster, Ont. The following is a quick synopsis of the talks of the three guest speakers.



VICKI THORN, founder of National Office of Post Abortion Healing & Reconciliation and Project Rachel, spoke about the effects of contraception, especially the birth control pill.

Since 1960 use of the birth control pill has changed the welcomed child into the “wanted” child and has led to the desire to have the “perfect” child (genetics). The pill has changed our fertility - women on the pill do not ovulate and men’s sperm count has dropped by 50% due partly to the large amounts of estrogen now in our water supplies.

The pill has been a huge chemistry experiment. It has brought about “recreational” sex as the norm which expanded abortion to being a legality which led to more promiscuous sex which led to divorce in epidemic numbers. This has led to children of divorce, with no roots and being raised very often in day cares. Experimentation, instability, and searching resulting in delayed adulthood have become a way of life as has scepticism, cynicism, drug dependency. Over-monitoring for outside activities, heavy access to TV, news, video games, violence and sex have made them as young adults unattached and distrustful finding it difficult to

make decisions and commitments.

Thorn feels hopeful in that these young adults are also collaborative, motivated, discerning, and honest. She says we must go out of our way to extend ourselves, to love and to challenge young adults.



DOUG SCOTT, Co-founder of Life Decisions International and founder of Corporate Funding Project, works tirelessly to expose Planned Parenthood (PP) the largest abortion provider in the world. In 2007 it made ONE BILLION DOLLARS from abortion! And, PP holds a non-profit status!!

PP now holds in savings \$543.1 million and is the most uncontrolled organization in North America. PP promotes one-child families and encourages contraception and abortion. They do not offer counselling to women in crisis, offering abortion as their only alternative. In 2004 they distributed 983,537 Morning After Pills and in 2006 they distributed 1,436,846. They are also big promoters of condoms - in 2004 STD treatments totalled 2,527,917 and in 2006 the total was 2,703,917; the increase in STD’s indicates the futility of condom use. Conclusion - Their great human experiment is one huge disaster for humanity. **Under the guise of “Action Canada for Development and Population”, PP gets federal funding. In Canada, PP has adopted the new name “Canadian Federation for Sexual Health”.** Scott says he is tired of the hypocrisy and of people who say they’re Christian, but under the guise of tolerance, would never speak out against abortion. He says he is not tired of working with

pro-life people. “It’s God’s timing! God’s in charge - even of our fertility.”



STEVEN MOSHER, President of the Population Research Institute, answered the question “Who is funding population control?” The UN Population Fund (UNPF), The World Bank - (U.S.), International Monetary Fund - (Britain), International Planned Parenthood. These four work together.

“How do they succeed in their goal of limiting population?” They create a sense of fear by claiming to the various countries “You have a population problem!” They demand that the country put in place a population control policy and if the country doesn’t comply with their demands it is threatened with “then no help will come to you”.

The population policy under the guise of “Reproductive Health” includes contraception, abortion, sterilization. There is in effect a take over of that country’s Ministry of Health. For example: In Peru within 3 years, 300,000 mostly poor native women (Incans) were sterilized. “Ligation Festivals” were held for sterilization through tubal ligations (some died from unhygienic conditions). Meanwhile treatable diseases were put on the back burner.

In China, the one child policy has been funded by UNPF with their full knowledge of the brutality and injustice that is ongoing. When the U.S. cut their funding under the Bush administration, Canada picked up the slack under Paul Martin. \$425,000,000 was spent on UNPF from all sources. Mosher hopes that Canada will stop funding UNFP.

THE COURAGE OF UNIVERSITY OF CALGARY STUDENTS ... Absolutely Amazing

GENOCIDE AWARENESS PROJECT at UNIVERSITY OF CALGARY - CCBR Newsletter

After having displayed Genocide Awareness Project (GAP) four times since 2006, Campus Pro-Life (CPL) planned to do GAP again this semester. **But this time the university told the club that, due to complaints from other students, it would have to display its GAP signs inward, making it impossible for passers by to see the imagery without going out of their way to do so.**

CPL members refused to comply with this unjust demand, knowing it would hugely diminish GAP's effectiveness. So, before sunrise on March 31, with the temperature at -10 degrees C, they arrived on campus and set up the exhibit. **That afternoon, Campus Security served the students with a "Notice to Vacate" ordering the removal of their signs - and themselves.**



Common behaviour at GAP: students often glance curiously at the images as they walk by or gaze upon them as they stand at a distance. Even though, at times, no dialogue takes place with GAP volunteers, such moments may be the only time these students will receive factual information on abortion during their academic careers.



Pro-abortion students attempt to suppress GAP by trying to block the display from being seen. The U of C condoned this act by refusing to protect the pro-life students' freedom-of-expression rights, which the university had publicly acknowledged during previous GAP displays.

That evening, the students gathered to strategize. Would they return to campus with GAP the next day as planned? Should they defy the university's "Notice to Vacate"? While they discussed their options, cell phones began ringing as media (newspaper, radio, and television) were contacting the students for comment. CTV News even came to the students' meeting to take video footage of their planning and then made the issue their lead story at 11:30 p.m. that night!

The students met to strategize. **What would the university do if the students defied its "Notice to Vacate"? Would the administration actually arrest its own students? Would they face academic discipline, even be prevented from graduating? Would it be worth the risk? Contemplating these intimidating questions, the students were emboldened by these words from Gregg Cunningham, the creator of GAP:**

"These students have a rare opportunity to change the course of Canadian history regarding speech rights if they have the courage to stand up for the rights of all Canadians and invite arrest. The press needs to be reminded that what is at stake here are the speech rights of all Canadians, including the press.

"These students have nothing to fear. ... They will not be abandoned if they defy this academic tyranny. There is no employer for whom they will ever work who will refuse to hire them because they were arrested for participating in a peaceful student protest. Their arrest will become a badge of courage for which they will later become proud. Someone has to have the courage of a Rosa Parks who when she was ordered to the back of the bus said, 'No more! Arrest me.' She forced the state to defend the indefensible and history rightly records her as a heroine in the struggle for social reform.

*"What I really want these students to know is that a chance like this comes along once in a lifetime if at all. This is the kind of thing which will inspire other students to demand their freedoms at universities all over Canada. **Tomorrow a female student is going to walk past your display site and she is going to be pregnant. Her baby will live or die as a***

consequence of the direction in which your signs are facing. This is about life and death, freedom and tyranny. Someday your GAP students will have children of their own and having parents who were willing to be arrested in defence of life will provide an example of courage which will change the lives of those children as they grow to adulthood. This is much bigger than they can possibly imagine."

The next morning, eleven brave students gathered with GAP signs and prepared to march onto campus. They held a press conference that included CTV News, Global News, City TV, and the Calgary Herald newspaper. Then the students carried the GAP signs onto campus as the media followed.

Security was waiting as the students arrived at their usual location, but did not prevent them from setting up - how could they with a swarm of media recording everything. Other club members arrived, and the group soon began debating their peers, and did so through mid-afternoon.

Fortunately, there were no arrests and no further "Notices to Vacate." In fact, the university was rightly chastised in the media. The Calgary Herald commented, *"So much for Calgary's premier centre of learning as a bastion of tolerance, where the search for truth may be conducted in an atmosphere of forthright debate among people holding diverse opinions. If the administration doesn't like the opinion, it may try to suppress it."*

Thankfully, the members of Campus Pro-Life had the courage to defy this suppression and were well-equipped to do so. In the weeks leading up to GAP, CCBR staff trained the students in pro-life apologetics and in defending the abortion-genocide comparisons. As well, CCBR and CPL watched Eyes on the Prize, a very inspiring documentary about the Civil Rights Movement and all the opposition its activists, many of whom were students, struggled to overcome. We at CCBR are grateful to you, our supporters, who enable us to work closely with these modern-day world-changers.

Pro-Choice to Pro-Life ... a Personal Story

"In the fall of 2007, I saw the Genocide Awareness Project (GAP) display at the University of Calgary (U of C). Prior to seeing this GAP display, I had decided that despite my Roman Catholic upbringing and pro-life roots, I was going to be pro-choice. I was a university student now, why shouldn't I have an open mind? I remember talking with some girls in my dorm, and even going as far as to say that **if I were to get pregnant now, I would without a doubt obtain an abortion.** I thought that, medically, abortions were more safe than delivering, that women had a right to choose when and when not to be pregnant, and that if something was legal, it was obviously justified.

Walking by the display, I felt anger - extreme hatred and disgust. These feelings were so intense, and I had never felt so much hatred towards a group of people that I didn't even know. I remember standing and talking to a few of the people 'on the other side of the fence.' ...After listening to some of the arguments made by the pro-lifers, I remember going to talk to the pro-choicers who were all rallying around, chanting, and who had large banners that everyone was autographing.

"Seeing the display for the second day made me even angrier. I actually remember being so angry that I felt sick to my stomach, like I had to vomit. I thought it was disgusting that people were allowed to do this, to impose their viewpoints on others, to display graphic pictures of a medical procedure and to 'proselytize' their church's stance on abortion. **Going home that night, I couldn't sleep.
