Evil Will Flourish If Good Men Do Nothing

- *President's message by Phil Arnsby*

On January 29, 2007, there was an International Day of Commemoration in Memory of the Victims of the Holocaust at the European headquarters of the UN in Geneva. For the first time, on the internet, I viewed the Holocaust death camps with horror and utter disgust - the hundreds of photos and stories of the systematic destruction of over 6 million human beings. So sickening, so unbelievable... "man's inhumanity to man".



Irwin Cotler, Canadian parliamentarian, delivered the keynote lecture at that commemoration part of which is as follows:

"Whenever I think about the Holocaust, I am reminded of what my parents taught me as a young boy: that there are things in Jewish history that are too terrible to be believed, but not too terrible to have happened. That Oswiecim, Mjjanek, Dachau, Treblinka - these are beyond vocabulary. For the Holocaust is uniquely evil in its gynocidal singularity, where biology was inescapably destiny, a war against the Jews in which, as Elie Wiesel put it, "not all victims were Jews, but all Jews were victims."

Some 60 years after the Holocaust, we have to ask ourselves: What have we learned, and what must we do?

...we have to understand that the mass murder of millions is not a matter of abstract statistics. ...As our sages tell us: "Whoever saves a single life, it is as if he or she has saved an entire universe." and whoever has killed a single person, it is as if they have killed an entire universe. The abiding imperative: that we are each, wherever we are, the guarantors of each other's destiny.

...the genocide of European Jewry succeeded not only because of the culture of hate and industry of death, but because of conspiracies of silence. And we have witnessed an appalling indifference and inaction in our own day. In both the Balkans and Rwanda, we knew, but we did not act, just as we know and have yet to act in Darfur.

...Nazism succeeded, not only because of the "bureaucratization of genocide," as Robert Lifton put it, but because of the complicity of the elites. Judges, physicians, church leaders and teachers were all complicit in the Nazis' crimes. As Elie Wiesel put it, "Cold-blooded murder and culture did not exclude each other. If the Holocaust proved anything, it is that a person can both love poems and kill children". It is our responsibility to speak truth to power, and to hold power accountable to truth.

...It is the responsibility of all of us to give voice to the voiceless, as we seek to empower the powerless, be they the disabled, the poor, the refugee, the elderly, the women victims of violence, the vulnerable child, whoever they may be.

We remember - and we pray - that never again will we be silent in the face of evil."

Another Unborn Baby Saved!



In a world where bad news seems to be the norm, especially when it comes to pro-life issues, it is refreshing to know that beautiful things still happen. An unborn baby was recently saved from abortion here in London.

One of our members called me at the office one day, very distraught, because her daughter was scheduled to have an abortion very soon - even though the family had been very supportive in welcoming the child. We hurriedly got together and discussed several ways to help her daughter through education about fetal development, risks of abortion procedures, the abortion/breast cancer link, and even requesting an ultra-sound of the baby. I e-mailed many pro-life friends to keep this teenager and her family in their prayers. Then, all we could do was wait.

As you know, the end of the story was a happy one. I asked the now-to-be-grandma, a month later, what the turning point was for her daughter and she said that it was the ultrasound. It took seeing the baby for her to realize that this was not just another baby, it was HER baby! It all came down to that, her baby's LIFE. Her baby wasn't a blob as she had been taught in health class...it was a living, breathing, beautiful human being!

In addition to the ultrasound, the fact that she had a supportive family made the decision to keep her baby much easier.

I want to thank all of you who, in one way or another, support our organization and help us keep our doors open five days a week. We are here to help those who call and also to supply educational resources to assist pro-lifers like you make a difference in your schools, places of employment, neighbourhoods, and churches.

The Canadian Hospice Palliative Care Association (CHPCA) changed their clear opposition stance to assisted suicide to a neutral position while seeking input from their membership. The Euthanasia Prevention office is working with palliative care medical professionals to create a ground-swell of opposition to this change in CHPCA policy.

In 2005, the British Medical Association (BMA) also moved from a position of opposition to assisted suicide to that of neutrality. The BMA faced an uprising by their membership. In 2006, the BMA voted to renew their opposition to assisted suicide and euthanasia.

Sick Kids Hospital in Toronto is discussing euthanasia of newborns with disabilities.

Are Condoms Effective in Preventing HIV/AIDS? ...Read on

The Philippines and Thailand A real-life example of how condoms fail to stop the spread of HIV/AIDS occurred in the Philippines and Thailand, two Southeastern Asian nations with approximately the same populations.

In 1984, the first case of HIV was detected in both of these nations. By 1987, Thailand had 112 cases of AIDS, and the Philippines had 135 cases. In 1991, the World Health Organization predicted that, by 1999, Thailand would have 70,000 deaths from the disease, and the Philippines would have 85,000 deaths.

In 1991, both nations took concrete and comprehensive measures against the spread of the HIV virus...but both directed their efforts in completely different directions.

The Thai Minister of Health enacted a "100% Condom Use Program." All brothels were required to have supplies of condoms, and condom vending machines were installed in all supermarkets, bars, restaurants, and other public gathering places. This program was widely accepted and implemented by the people of Thailand.

Two years later, Rene Bullecer, M.D., in co-operation with the Catholic Bishops Conference of the Philippines (CBCP) to establish the organization AIDS-Free Philippines (Chastity) as its official program to combat HIV/AIDS nationwide. The government signed on to this effort as well.

By the end of 2003, the disparity in the effectiveness of both types of both types of programs had become glaringly obvious, as shown in this table:

Parameter	THAILAND (promoting condoms)	PHILIPPINES (promoting chastity)
Adults and Children living with HIV	570,000	9,000
AIDS Deaths in 2003	58,000	500
Population	62,833,000	70,999,000
HIV Infection Rates per Million	9,072	113

This table shows that the Thai HIV infection rate is eighty times higher than the Filipino HIV infection rate.

The current rate of HIV infection in the United States, with all of our sex education, all of our sexual freedom, all of our advanced antiviral drugs, and all of our billions of condoms, is 3,900 per million, thirty times higher than in the Philippines.

What lesson does this teach us?

USAID has concluded that the reason that the Philippines has such a low incidence of HIV/AIDS is that youth have a very high rate of abstinence and married people largely remain faithful to their spouses.

Canadian Physicians for life released today the following statement by president of the organization, Dr. Will Johnston, in response to the new guideline released last week by the Society of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists of Canada, recommending that all pregnant women be offered prenatal genetic testing.



BABY STEPS TO A BRAVE NEW WORLD

You shouldn't have to believe that surgical abortion is politely hidden barbarism, our last acceptable form of capital punishment, to question the new push for prenatal screening launched last week by the Society of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists of Canada. The SOGC claims, in effect, that those who challenge the detect and destroy process for Down syndrome children want "the right to withhold this [prenatal] information from the women in their care."

Wrong. The problem is not the information but the moral vacuum chamber in which the new screening techniques are devised and promoted. We are going far beyond simply giving parents a helpful preview of their child in a value-neutral context. When Down syndrome fetuses are found, 89% are aborted. Because there is a system in place actually doing this, the public mind is continually posed an insidious question - Are some lives best seen as avoidable errors?

To cull defective children, ancient cultures used the quality control technology nearest to hand, generally some variation on a pile of rocks outside the city wall. True to the same spirit but better equipped, the SOGC promotes various "choices" - maternal blood tests and ultrasound to guess at the baby's faults before moving in with the amniocentesis needle and perhaps finishing off with an abortion.

Replacing unconditional love with an intolerance for imperfections is one harmful side effect of his new eugenics. One recent study showed that maternal-fetal bonding may be weakened by participating in the blood tests which the SOGC is advertising. Further, amniocentesis causes even healthy babies to be lost, as many as 22 a year in B.C. recently. And even hardened participants in the abortion-on-demand system are given pause by late-term abortions for minor flaws like cleft palate, as has happened within my own medical community.

The progress of eugenic abortion into the heart of our society is a classic example of "mission creep". In the 1960's, we were told that legal abortion would be a rare tragic act in cases of exceptional hardship. In the 70's abortion began to be both decried and accepted as birth control. In the 80's respected geneticists pointed out that it was cheaper to hunt for and abort Down's babies than to raise them. By the 90's that observation had been widely put into action. Now we are refining and extending our eugenic vision, with new test and abortion as our central tools.

Yet there are ways to reduce the proportion of children born with Down syndrome by a more civilized approach than finding them and killing them before birth. The SOGC could begin by educating Canadians about the optimum age for childbearing - closer to 24 than the current average of almost 30 years old. We could push for constructive changes in the workplace and in higher education so that young families could better participate. We all agree that making babies with younger eggs in younger moms means less Down syndrome and brings other health benefits.

There is no logical end to the consumerism and utilitarianism which puts unborn children on a potentially lethal probation. Human nature allows no limit to our aspirations for our children, yet because of the screening mentality there will be no limit to our dissatisfactions with them either. Once the last Down syndrome child is gone, we will find a new focus for our anxieties. Without a profound change of heart, it is foreseeable that this whole project will end badly.

Canadian Physicians for Life is an educational organization representing physicians who hold that reverence for every human life lies at the root of all medical tradition. Through the ages, this tradition has been expressed in the Oath of Hippocrates. It was rephrased in modern times in the Declaration of Geneva (1948), which says in part, "I will maintain the utmost respect for human life, from the time of conception; even under threat, I will not use my medical knowledge contrary to the laws of humanity."

Pro-Life Activist Earl Amyotte Died on Feb. 2, 2007

For nearly 3 decades Earl Amyotte of Windsor, Ontario, was a leading Canadian pro-life activist. He was a founding member of Campaign Life Coalition (CLC), the political arm of the pro-life movement in Canada, and was the first leader of the Pro-life Party of Canada. He also served as Windsor area President of CLC.

In recent years, Earl particularly enjoyed participating in Show the Truth Tours to show the ugly reality of abortion in order to dispel the notion that abortion is a viable solution to a difficult situation. Earl was a regular hospital picketer with his 'friends across the river' in Detroit, Michigan, and would travel 15 hours by bus to attend the annual March for Life every January in Washington, D.C.

Earl had little patience for those whom he called "The Meet, Greet, and Retreat" crowd - those Christians who claimed to be pro-life but did nothing. He was a defender of the rights of children in the womb, their moms, the handicapped and elderly-at-risk and everyone who was disadvantaged. Earl was an extraordinary character doing extraordinary work for his Lord and Saviour.

May he and all the faithful departed rest in peace.



When What Seems Broken is Perfect

How can the value and purpose of a life be determined? Can these be measured by longevity, intelligence or the productive contribution of an individual to the economic base of society? Even more important, who has the right or ability to make this judgment?

My husband and I were recently faced with a very difficult situation. We are in our 40's, educated and financially stable. We have 5 children at home and we love sports and travel. The kids do well at school, are athletic, and all are healthy as horses. Life was good to us. We were pleasantly surprised when we discovered that we were expecting a new life to love and nurture.

We first heard of our unborn daughter's genetic condition long before she was diagnosed. It was considered a lethal condition, an extra 13th chromosome. Most babies don't make it to birth and those that do live a few years and are severely disabled. I thought, "Well, what is the point of that life?"

When the geneticist uttered the dreaded words, "your daughter has trisomy 13" and it was a diagnosis

about my baby and not someone else's, the reality was entirely different. With the ferocity of a lioness, I wanted to love and protect this little girl, and do all that I could for her. If her existence was only to be a few more months of kicks and flutters in utero, then I wanted her to have that life for the sake of both of us. We named her Annie.

After the diagnosis, the research began. It was frantic, and went long into the night for months. We researched medical details and personal stories. We communicated with parents all over the world who had a child with this very rare condition. We discovered that the babies can live longer, but they may need a lot of medical treatment. The children, called "survivors" were blissfully happy and progressed developmentally, albeit slowly. It became increasingly clear to us, that unless the medical intervention to provide life was excessive, Annie was better alive than dead.

We were not sure how we could do it. Could I ever develop the patience for a child who may not be able to sit on her own for a year? How could we fit Annie's care and needs into

our busy schedule? We were more frightened than we had ever had been in our lives. Love for Annie compelled us forward.

Annie was born full term, crying. She was mildly afflicted, as the syndrome goes. She needed a very small amount of oxygen and had hypoglycemia. Annie could not take all of her nutrition orally and so she had an NG tub (nasal gastric tube), which was a tube that went in through her nose down into her stomach. I became skilled at its reinsertion, every 3 days. We fed her expressed breast milk. Somehow, we dealt with all of the issues.

We knew that with time, Annie would take more feedings orally and her need for oxygen would lessen, and likely be eliminated completely.

We were aware that the first year would be rough. Everyone pitched in, our 12 year old son took over the lawn maintenance and his older sisters took on Annie's developmental progress and bought "mind stimulating" music and ordered her a "Bumbo seat" to help develop strength. The whole family came together in ways that I never dreamed possible. We discovered how true our friends

and family were by their support and encouragement. Somehow, the homework got done and the gang made it to their soccer games.

At age 75 days, Annie smiled at us for the first time. Even now, a year later, the memory of that first and only smile causes me to cry.

Annie experience respiratory distress at age 80 days and was transferred by ambulance to the Children's hospital. The physicians told us she had pneumonia. Our beloved baby died less than 24 hours later.

There are two ironies to this story.

The first is that we thought we had a choice of life for Annie but the reality is that we did not. The medical records, which we instinctively

felt compelled to obtain and have had reviewed, reveal no signs of pneumonia. An effective "Do not resuscitate" was ordered without our knowledge or consent. The final computerized medication report from the intensive care of an excellent hospital is inexplicably missing.

The hospital issued a letter of apology stating that sometimes "communication does not occur in as clear and consistent a fashion as we would wish. For that, we are very sorry." Recent developments in medical science can be used to diagnose and terminate certain lives but the choice to use medicine to prolong these lives doesn't seem to be an option.

During her 80 days, our little Annie

taught us our greatest lessons in life. Through her life, we experience the deepest sorrow and the most intense love. She taught us the true meaning and purpose of life and we are forever changed as a family. Our children have learned that if they are ever in need, their family will love them, protect them and do anything to support them just like we did for Annie. They developed an incredible empathy for the disabled and the vulnerable.


The ultimate irony is that this little girl who seemed so broken, flawed and seemingly without purpose or value, was in fact, perfect after all.
